September 20, 1875

The first negotiation concluded at Berens River on September 20, 1875 and continued at different First Nation communities around Lake Winnipeg. The second Treaty trip began in July 1876 and concluded in September.

“The stories that the Elder told me was that the “Queen and/or King” “Kitchi Okima/Sa” would take care of us. In return for that, we would allow Newcomers to pass through our lands and to work.”
